Tim Flannery

A writer, scientist and explorer, Tim Flannery was Principal Research Scientist in Mammalogy at the Australian Museum in Sydney from 1984-1999. A leading thinker in environmental science, Flannery is director of the South Australian Museum and chairman of both State Science Council and Sustainability Roundtable. He is also the National Geographic Society's Australasian representative.

His award-winning books include *The Future Eaters: An Ecological History of the Australasian Lands & People* (1994) and *Tree-Kangaroos: A Curious Natural History* (1996).

Flannery's groundbreaking book on global warming, *The Weather Makers: The History and Future Impact of Climate Change*, was published in Australia in October 2005. It is to be released in more than 20 countries in 2006 and has played a key role in international discussion of the issue.
